"Domestic Violence in Tillamook County is below the state average"

41% don't know
35% disagree with statement
Only 9% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 2.23/5

"Domestic Violence is not talked about in Tillamook County"

14% don't know
33% disagree with statement
33% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 2.89/5

"Domestic Violence is caused by alcohol and/or drug use"

4% don't know
Only 9% disagree with statement
70% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 3.92/5

"Domestic Violence is caused by stress"

4% don't know
Only 10% disagree with statement
64% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 3.81/5

"Domestic Violence is caused by anger"

Perceptions: Domestic violence in Tillamook County

“Domestic Violence is the woman's fault”

2% don't know
92% disagree with statement
Only 2% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 1.21/5

“Women are just as violent as men”

5% don't know
22% disagree with statement
53% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 3.46/5

“Domestic Violence is a private issue-not to be discussed outside of the home”

2% don't know
88% disagree with statement
Only 5% agree with statement
Rating 1-5 is 1.38/5

COMMENTS:

The perception of residents is domestic violence is caused by:

Anger	78% agree
Alcohol and/or drug use	70% agree
Stress	64% agree

In general, residents think that DV is a big issue, is NOT primarily a problem of minority families, and is NOT the women's fault.

It is interesting that 88% feel that DV is NOT a private issue and can be discussed outside the home...but only 33% disagree with the statement that DV is NOT talked about in Tillamook county.

Just over half of residents feel that women are just as violent as men,

Examples of Domestic Violence:

Drug/alcohol use	50%

Possessiveness/jealousy	4%
Loses it/snaps/explodes	4%

COMMENTS:

Residents have a wide range of behavior that they consider domestic violence.

They also feel that Drugs/Alcohol use, stress, anger and money problems are the primary causes of domestic violence.

Personally have experienced domestic violence

Personally experienced DV 25%

COMMENTS:

The research provides the ability to project domestic violence incidence in Tillamook County. For instance, in the last 5 years, 37% state that a family member has experienced domestic violence with 30% of those instances taking place in Tillamook County. That means that a minimum of 11% of the Tillamook population, 1,145 household have a family member who has experienced DV.

Projection Summary:

Know someone, not family, who has experienced domestic violence
 Incidence 50% x 59% Tillamook County = 29% x 24,262 = 7,036
 Family member has experienced domestic violence
 Incidence 37% x 30% Tillamook County = 11% x 24,262 = 2,668
 Personally have experienced domestic violence
 Incidence 34% x 49% Tillamook County = 16% x 12,500 F = 2,000

Who contact FIRST if you or someone in your household experienced DV

TCWRC

93% did NOT state Tillamook County Women's Resource Center

Primary responses:

Police 53%
 Relative 15%
 Other responses less than 7%

COMMENTS:

In an emergency situation, contacting the police is the typical response. But many domestic violence situations are not an immediate emergency – such as “control” domestic violence issues – so it is of concern that 93% of Tillamook County residents would not first contact TCWRC.
